

#### **CELEBRATING 30 YEARS OF KIDSPORT**

The KidSport concept was launched in 1993 by board and staff at Sport BC as a way to help address the challenges faced by many families when registering their children in organized sport. From a modest start in that first year, KidSport has since expanded across the country to become a national entity with 11 provincial/territorial chapters and over 160 community chapters.

Thirty years later, KidSport BC with support from local community chapters across the province have funded a season of sport for over 80,000 kids totaling more than \$19 million in grants.

To mark this important milestone, we invited KidSport volunteers, ambassadors, donors and other supporters to a special 30th anniversary celebration at the Vancouver Lookout where we reflected on how far we've come and our collective impact for amateur sport over the past thirty years.

In acknowledgement of this special milestone, the province of BC officially proclaimed October 1-7, 2023 as KidSport BC Powered by Sport BC Week and had an impact statement read in house of representatives to acknowledge the impactful work of the KidSport program over the past 30 years.



# KIDSPORT BC NAMED CHARITY PARTNER FOR VANCOUVER WHITECAPS 50/50 PROGRAM
