
Thank You

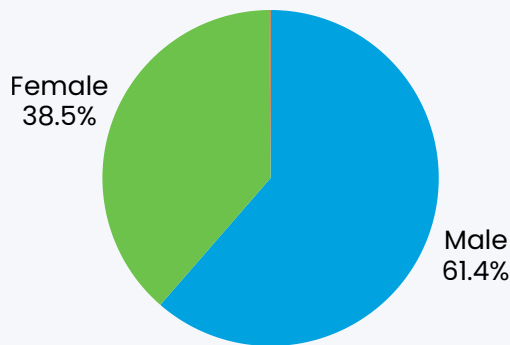

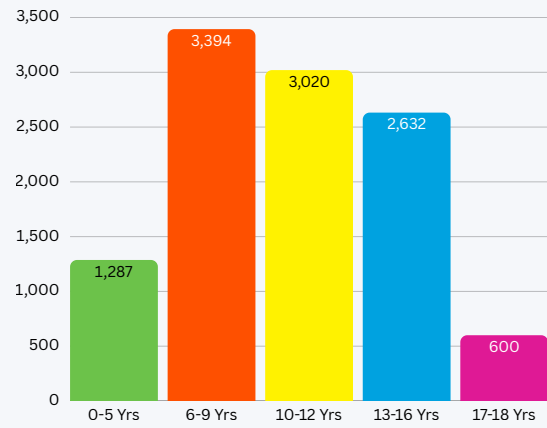

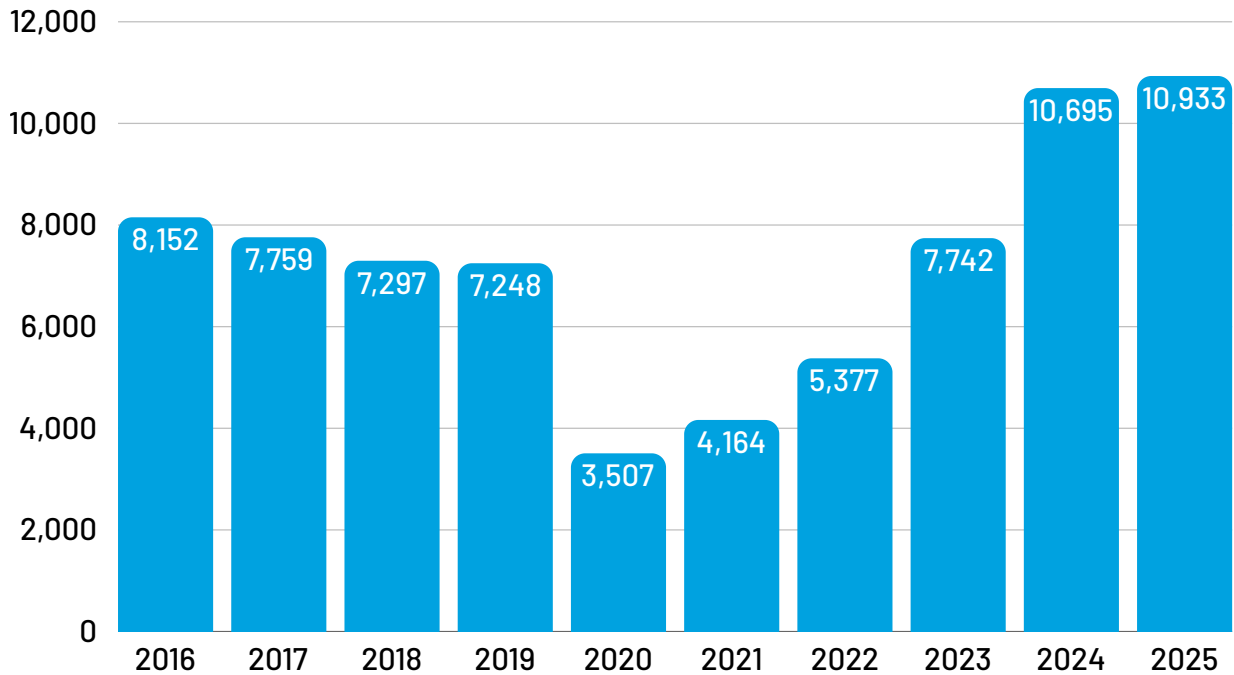

We funded more kids in BC than ever before in 2026. Grant totals have rising sharply since sport returned after the pandemic. The number of kids funded in 2025 was more than 2.6x the total in 2021, just five years ago. Kids need sport, and that's why we're committed to helping as many as possible.

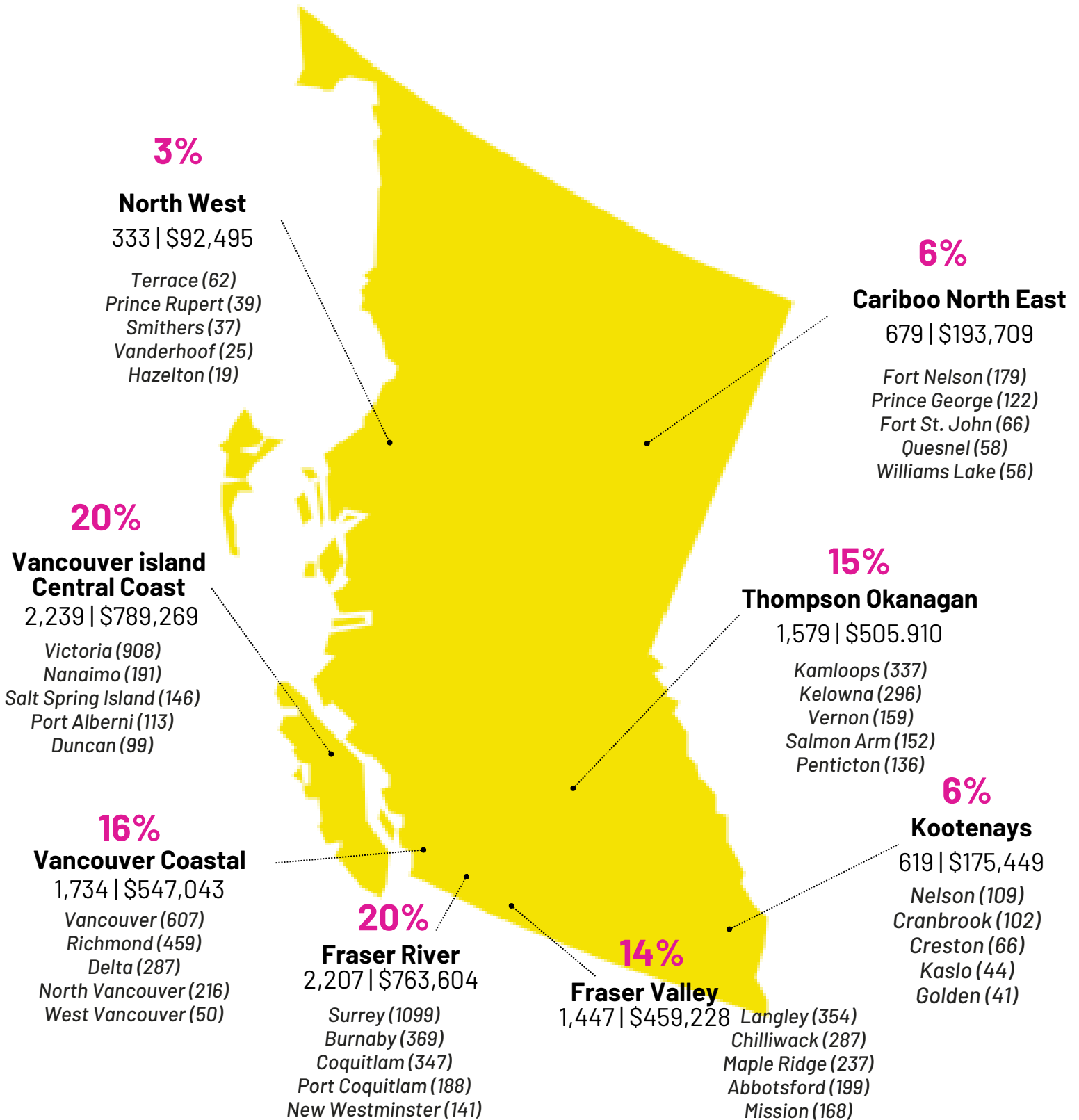

TOP-FUNDED SPORTS IN 2025

KidSport in BC is operated as a program of Sport BC. To be eligible for funding, the child must be registered with a sport club that is affiliated with a member sport organization of Sport BC and in a program that demonstrates a sustained sport experience led by a qualified coach. These were the top funded sports in 2025.

2025 YEAR IN REVIEW

RONNIE AND KATHY PATERSON HONOURED WITH PRESIDENT'S AWARD

Ronnie and Kathy have been instrumental leaders in the success of the KidSport Surrey/White Rock chapter since its inception in 2011. Over their 15-year involvement, the chapter's impact in the community has grown significantly, alongside the community's population—from supporting 507 kids in 2015 and distributing \$127,000 to funding more than 1,000 kids each year, totaling nearly \$400,000.

As chapter leaders, Ronnie and Kathy have engaged their personal and professional networks to support local kids, hosting events such as their annual Golf Tournament and Nite of Champions Gala, which raised an incredible \$400,000 last year.

After 15 years of service to their community and the KidSport program, Ronnie and Kathy are taking a step back to focus on their family. We are incredibly grateful for their outstanding contributions to KidSport and for their steadfast leadership in the Surrey / White Rock community.

SPORT BC COMMUNITY SPORT HERO AWARD HONOUREES

The Sport BC Community Sport Hero Awards (CSHA) program recognizes coaches, officials, mentors, and administrators who have dedicated themselves to amateur sport at the community level. The following individuals were honoured for their contributions to their local KidSport chapter in 2025.

Gail Weber and Lisa Stewart, Fort St. John

Both Gail and Lisa have been involved with the KidSport North Peace chapter for many years. Gail has been involved since the chapter's inception, leading the volunteer committee as chair, and Lisa been treasurer since November 2005.

First established in 1999, the chapter has helped fund a season of sport for more than 730 kids living in Fort St John and within the zone of school district #60.



Bob Jackson, Richmond

Bob has contributed many years of exemplary service, helping raise awareness and funds for KidSport Richmond since the chapter was established in 2008. Since then, the chapter has supported more than 4,200 kids in sport and distributed more than \$1.2M in registration fees.

Bob's leadership and dedication to KidSport have been instrumental to the success of the Richmond chapter. His passion for sport and commitment to the cause are inspiring, and the impact he has made through his many roles in sport in the community are wide reaching and deeply felt.



2025 YEAR IN REVIEW

WHITECAPS 50/50 PARTNERSHIP REACHES MAJOR MILESTONE

KidSport BC has been a partner with the Whitecaps 50/50 program since 2022, and we've achieved some pretty great results since then. We are grateful for the opportunity to engage fans in supporting our program, and reached a major milestone in 2025, surpassing \$1M in net proceeds, which has helped fund a season of sport for more than 3,000 kids over the last four years.

CANUCKS FOR KIDS FUND PROVIDES SUPPORT FOR HOCKEY AND LACROSSE GRANTS

The Canucks for Kids Fund increased their support in 2025 to help ensure more kids could play hockey and lacrosse in communities across BC. Their support helped over 450 kids gain access to these sports. The club also generously provided sponsorship for 12 lucky athletes to participate in their Junior Canucks Hockey Camp last summer, giving those kids the opportunity to improve their skills and create some special memories.

KIDSPORT VOLUNTEER FORUM

More than 200 volunteers support the KidSport program in local communities across the province, each playing an important role in raising awareness, processing grant applications, and raising funds to support kids in need in their community. In October, we brought together 35 of these volunteers at the River Rock Casino Resort for our two-day KidSport Volunteer Forum, focused on learning, collaboration, and community. 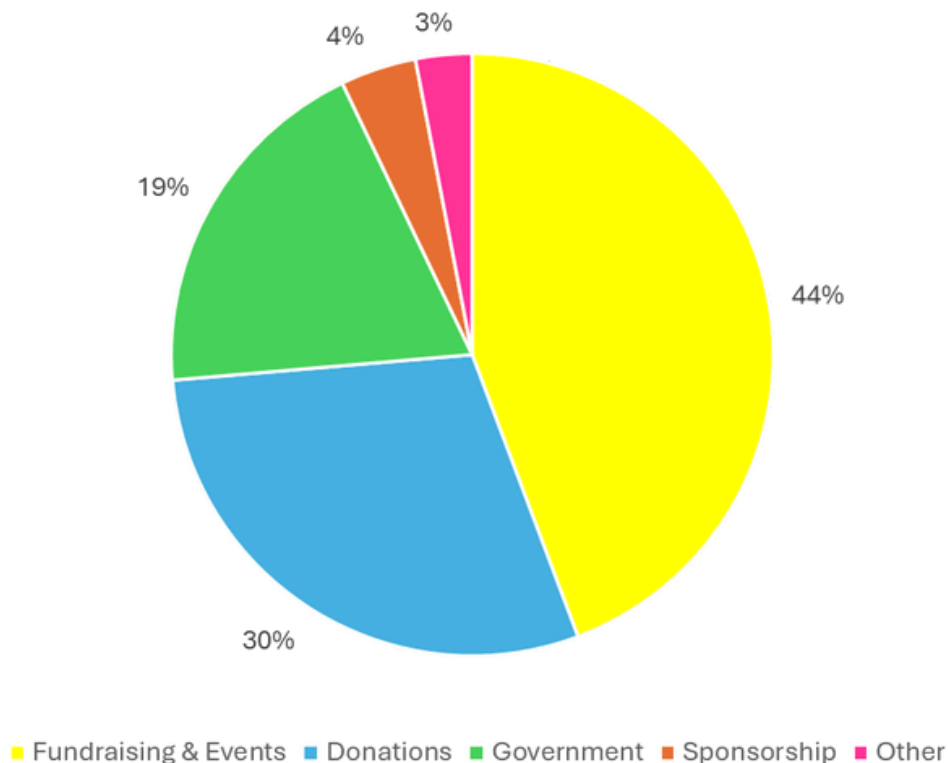
